Program Director, Occupational Therapy Assistant

Provide leadership and direction for the Occupational Therapy Assistant program and maintain compliance with national accreditation standards. Requirements include a master's degree; Certification and Licensure as an Occupational Therapist or Occupational Therapy Assistant; five years of documented practice as an occupational therapist or occupational therapy assistant; and licensed to practice in the state of Illinois.

Biology/Anatomy & Physiology Instructor

Tenure-track faculty position to start fall semester 2019. Graduate degree in biology or a health-related field required. Qualified applicants who also have a background in microbiology, or experience and/or training with online teaching will receive extra consideration.

Economics Instructor

Tenure-track faculty position to start fall semester 2019. Graduate degree in economics or in a field inclusive of economics required. Preference will be given to candidates with a broad emphasis in micro- and/or macro-economics.

English Instructor

Tenure-track faculty position to start fall semester 2019. Master's degree in English required. An educational background that includes coursework in composition theory, pedagogy, and assessment will be viewed favorably.

History Instructor

Tenure-track faculty position to start fall semester 2019. Graduate degree in history required. Preference will be given to candidates with a broad background in the history of western civilization, although a broad background in U.S. history is also of interest.

Music Instructor

Tenure-track faculty position to start fall semester 2019. Master's degree with a minimum of 18 graduate hours concentration in music is required. Individuals with an emphasis in vocal & instrumental music with high level piano skills, the ability to teach a wide range of college music classes and private applied lessons, the ability to run rehearsals and direct ensembles, and experience in on-line instruction will be given preferential consideration.
